# WHO WE ARE AND HOW WE WORSHIP

The Table is place where everyone is welcome and lives are changed by the power of the Holy Spirit. Each week we worship through song, studying God's Word, giving, prayer and communion.

## A WEEKLY WORD

What is Advent? Advent is a season observed in many Christian Churches as a time of expectant waiting and preparation for the celebration of Jesus' birth at Christmas, as well as the return of Jesus at the second coming. The season begins four Sundays before Christmas and concludes on Christmas Eve.

## COMMUNION AT THE TABLE

WHAT is Communion? Sometimes referred to as The Lord's Supper or Eucharist, Communion was commanded by Jesus on the night before his death when he shared bread and wine with his disciples. The bread and wine (juice) we receive today represents the body and blood of Jesus Christ and the sacrifice he gave for us. Jesus invites us to take part in this to celebrate and experience the unconditional love and grace of God.

WHO can receive Communion? All who love Jesus Christ, earnestly repent of their sin, and seek to live in peace with one another are invited to join us to receive the body and blood of Christ—regardless of age or church membership.

How do we receive Communion? Prepare your heart by praying, confessing and repenting before receiving Communion, just as Jesus commands us to do. Take as much time as you need for this. We receive Communion by intinction, which means the bread is dipped into the wine (juice). Open your hands and let the server place the bread in your palm, and dip the bread into the wine (juice). You can respond with "Thanks be to God" or "Amen."
